Meat Meal

Indications

Meat Meals are a major by-product of the slaughter industry and are an important ingredient for the diets of pigs and poultry.

Composition

Typical Analysis

Protein	50%
Calcium	10%
Phosphorus	5%
Lysine	2.75%
Methionine	0.55%
ME POULTRY	10.04 MJ/kg
DE PIG	12.1 MJ/kg

Directions for use

Use as directed by your Consultant Nutritionist.

Meat meals can be used in all diets of poultry and pig for all ages. It is recommended however that when used in diets that Meat meal not be the only source of protein due to the variability in the products available in the market place. Normally the excessive use of this product will be limited by the calcium and phosphorus levels required in poultry and pig diets.

Due to the varied processing conditions it is advisable that before use, the nutrient profile of the meal is determined to enable the setting of the correct inclusion levels.

Suggested inclusion levels are as follows: Pigs, Poultry (Broiler & Layer) up to 15%

Discussion

The most common form of Meat meal is batch dried rendering, where the offal is heated by steam at a high pressure in a jacketed cylindrical cooker. Water is then evaporated until the dry tallow and solids of a very low moisture content remain (about 8%).

The major problem in using meat meal in pig and poultry diets is their variability in nutrient composition. This depends upon the type of livestock being slaughtered at the killing facility.

Storage

Store in a cool dry place. Store out of direct sunlight.

Expiry after Manufacture
